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

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## The sand of Saints



ST PATRICK was a Welshman who converted the people of Ireland in the 4th century. We celebrate his feast on 17th March.

I am sure no other country in the world has contributed more to the spreading of the Gospel than Ireland. Missionaries have left her shores, journeying to every corner of the globe in order to hand on the faith.

Many years ago I remember reading that there were 24 million Americans of Irish extraction. I am sure at least two-thirds of the people of this country could boast at least one Irish ancestor.

Bishop Fulton Sheen, in his book LIFE IS WORTH LIVING pays this charming tribute to the Irish:

On the last day, when the Good Lord comes in the clouds of Heaven to judge the living and the dead He will not show Himself to all people in just exactly the same way. Each will see Him according to his own national characteristics.

I wonder, when He comes, if He will not seem to the Germans who love pomp and circumstance, as a great King. Perhaps, He will show Himself to the Spaniards, who love the beauty of religion, with His face shining as the sun and His garments white as snow. He will come to the people of India, who love mortification, showing scars on hands and feet and side. BUT TO THE IRISH, HE WILL SHOW SOMETHING THAT HE WILL SHOW TO NO OTHER PEOPLE. HE WILL SHOW THEM HIS GRATITUDE FOR THEIR HUMOUR; HE WILL SHOW THEM HIS SMILE!
